### **Overview**

My program of research aims to transform health care provision to enhance child health outcomes for vulnerable populations, specifically families who experience preterm birth. I am a nurse scientist specializing in preterm birth, infant nutrition, early life experiences, and family centred care. I have expertise in mixed methods designs, clinical trials, community engagement, and patient oriented research. My developing program of research examines the role of infant feeding, specifically provision of breastmilk and donor human milk, in informing health outcomes for vulnerable infants. I routinely engage clinicians, patients/parents, and policy makers in research to ensure that outcomes are meaningful and understandable to the knowledge user. In my current role as a post-doctoral fellow in the Azad lab, I am bridging my clinical training with basic science to develop a precision nutritional intervention that is tailored towards maternal-infant genetics in the preterm population.

In my role as co-lead on the iPOP Study, I draw on my clinical expertise, community engagement skills and understanding of preterm populations. My work on the iPOP study has allowed me to develop an extensive network of clinicians and scientists across the globe. I have used this opportunity to build my leadership skills as well as emphasize my expertise in a highly qualified, multidisciplinary team. Evidence from the iPOP study will move beyond the pandemic to provide mechanistic understanding of preterm birth that will inform future clinical practices to enhance child health outcomes across the globe.
