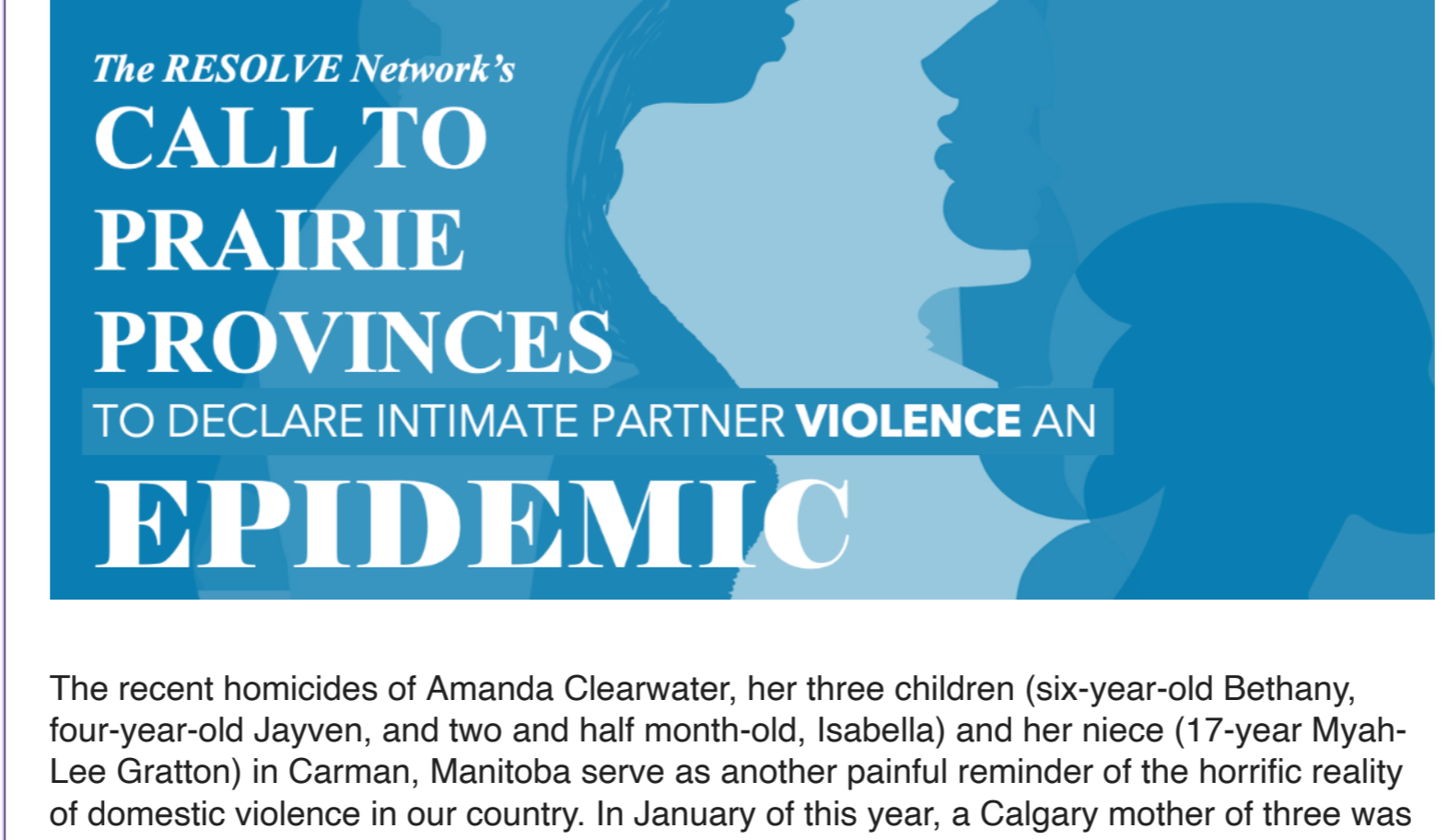




RESOLVE Network Update

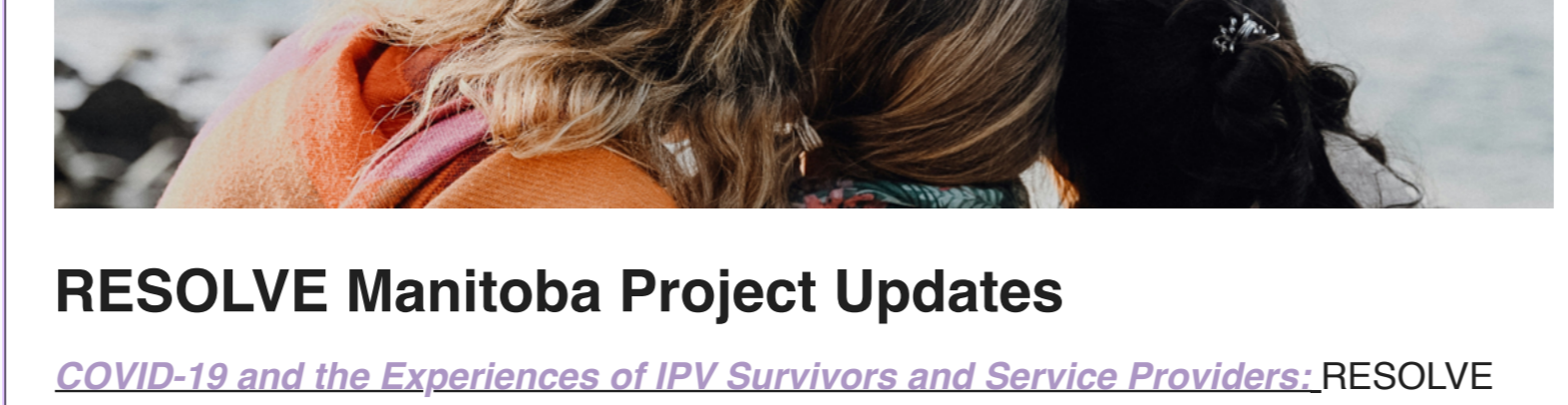

Examining the Nature & Context of IPV in 2SLGBTQ+ Communities: A recent publication authored by RESOLVE, delves into the topic of inadequate policing methods and their impact on the safety of 2SLGBTQ+ survivors of intimate partner violence.

Attachment and Child Health (ATTACH™): The ATTACH™ program is an intervention that has been effectively developed and evaluated for at-risk parents and children experiencing toxic stressors.

RESOLVE Manitoba Project Updates

COVID-19 and the Experiences of IPV Survivors and Service Providers: RESOLVE recently completed the COVID-19 and the Experiences of IPV Survivors and Service Providers research project.

Awareness to Action: Moving from Screening and Assessment to Developing Appropriate Parenting Plans After Family Violence in the Family Justice System (A2A): This project will continue the work of the previous Family Violence Law project by sustaining the Manitoba Community of Practice and continuing to produce educational webinars, research briefs, and legal bulletins.

Assessing Capacity to Conduct Indigenous-Based Research and Engage with Indigenous Communities in the Prairie Provinces: The research team facilitated conversations and sharing circles with Indigenous community-based organizations and academics to examine RESOLVE's capacity to conduct community-engaged Indigenous research.

Improving Shelter Experience for Indigenous Women: We have formed our Advisory Committee for this project. This research project aims to contribute to our understanding of Indigenous women's experiences seeking help in Indigenous and non-Indigenous-led women's shelters.

Reducing Family Violence: Perspectives of Cultural Communities Interacting with Service Providers Applying Cultural Safety and Humility: We have received ethics approval for this project and will start recruiting research participants.

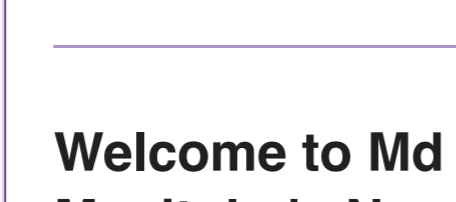
The Healing Journey: A Longitudinal Study of Women Who have been Affected by Intimate Partner Violence

- 1. "I Worry About My Kids' Safety When They Visit": Mothers' Perceptions of Father/Child Post-Separation Contact in the Context of IPV
2. "We Get Our Healing Through Traditional Ways": Canadian Indigenous Women's Use of Violence Against Women Shelters, Mainstream Counseling, and Traditional Healing
3. "Never Give Up, The Creator Has Good Things in Store for You": Risk Factors, Protective Factors, and Evidence of Resilience for Canadian Indigenous Women Abused by Intimate Partners

The RESOLVE team extends their heartfelt gratitude to Ashley Haller for her tireless dedication and remarkable contributions throughout the past few years.

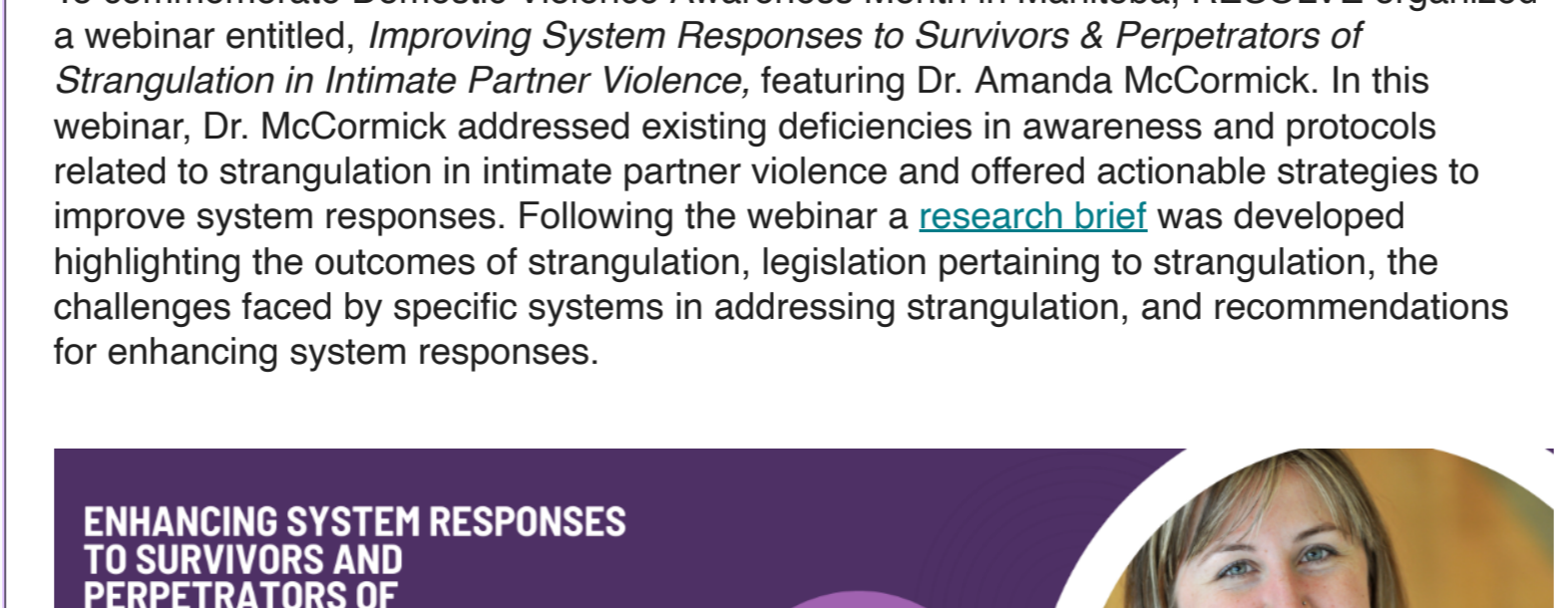
Welcome to Md Saidur Rashid Sumon, RESOLVE Manitoba's New Research Assistant

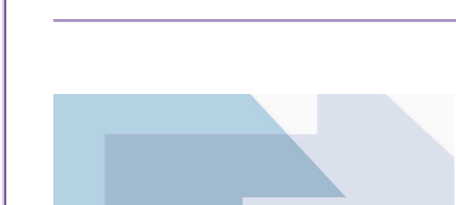
Passing of Dr. Mary Hampton

Sexual Assault Services of Saskatchewan (SASS) Launches Saskatchewan Sexual Assault Data Centre

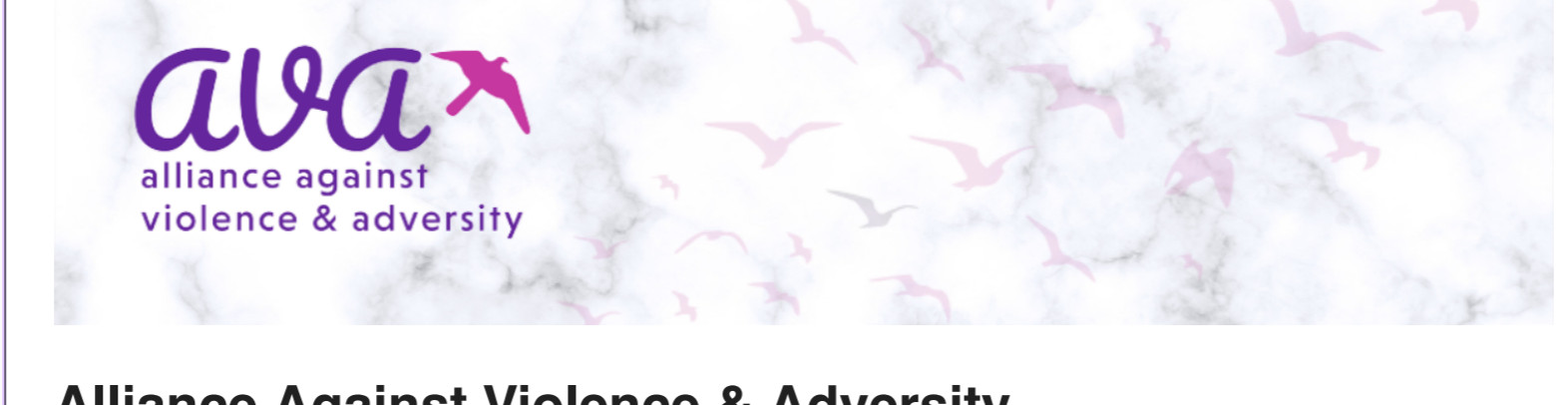

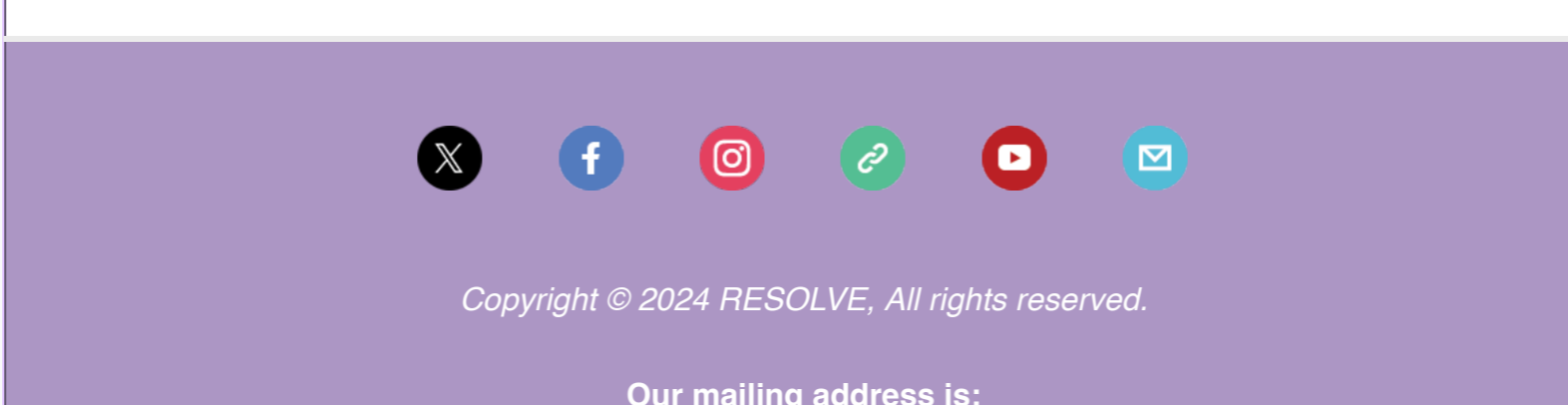
