This course focuses on the principles of teaching and learning for nursing practice. The course offers an exploration of the role of the nurse as educator role relative to the concept of health education as an intervention to empower clients to achieve their wellness potential and ultimately improve quality of life, and nursing education of students and intra-disciplinary colleagues, emphasizing quality of care practices and the phenomenon of competency and leadership.

NURS 601.58 SEXUAL HEALTH AND COUNSELING IN CANCER		Web-based	
The framework of this course encourages course participants to: 1) address and confront the ways in which their own, and society's attitudes and biases impact their practice; 2) increase knowledge regarding the ways in which people affected by cancer maintain healthy sexuality or, in contrast, struggle with sexual challenges; and 3) develop knowledge and skill with regard to assessment and interventions for common sexual health issues that arise in cancer care. Attention to issues of diversity will be integrated throughout.
